

# THE GOSPEL IN THE BOOK OF ACTS

In the book of Acts, we're going to see the gospel spread from Jerusalem to the ends of the earth, just as Jesus said it would, and despite a number of obstacles and trials that come along nothing can stop it. We're going to see the gospel spread to all different kinds of people, inviting them all into God's kingdom. We're going to see the power of the Holy Spirit, who enables people to see the glory of Jesus.

- We're going to see that the gospel is limitless It's for everyone!
- The spread of the gospel is limitless Nothing can stop it and nowhere is too far for it to go.
- The Holy Spirit is limitless Bringing power, healing and faith to everyone who believes the good news.
- The power of the gospel is limitless Bringing new life to the ends of the earth.

We're hoping this series will give us greater confidence to know that God is at work in us and at work in our city and region. There is no one beyond the reach of the gospel, so we can have confidence to bear witness to Jesus and his resurrection.

There is also a call to consider the resurrection for ourselves. The main characters in each chapter stake their lives on the truth of the resurrection. Rather than a comfortable existence, this book should shake us and provoke us to consider our own walk with Jesus. Are we prepared to stake our lives on it, to the point of expecting and rejoicing in suffering for the name of Jesus?

It is our hope that we'll press on to grow as disciples who sacrifice, serve and speak for the sake of others, to grow the renown of the gospel and to grow the church, all for the glory of Jesus. We can only do this, under God, in the power of His Spirit, so will you join us in praying that God's Spirit would be powerfully at work in us.

### WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT ACTS TO GET STARTED

Acts was written by Luke, who accompanied Paul on his missionary journeys, and it's second in a two part series that shows all Jesus began and continues to do in the world, through and for his people.

In Luke 1v1-4, we're told:


<sup>1</sup> Many have undertaken to draw up an account of the things that have been fulfilled among us, <sup>2</sup> just as they were handed down to us by those who from the first were eyewitnesses and servants of the word. <sup>3</sup> With this in mind, since I myself have *carefully investigated everything from the beginning*, I too decided to write *an orderly account* for you, most excellent Theophilus, <sup>4</sup> so that you may know the certainty of the things you have been taught.

Luke carefully investigated all that he wrote down so we may know the certainty of the things taught to us about Jesus and it's fair to say that the same method and goal is intended for Acts. In Acts 1v1-11, Luke writes:

- <sup>1</sup> In my former book, Theophilus, I wrote about *all that Jesus began to do and to teach* <sup>2</sup> until the day he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles he had chosen. <sup>3</sup> After his suffering, he presented himself to them and gave many convincing proofs that he was alive. He appeared to them over a period of forty days and spoke about the kingdom of God. <sup>4</sup> On one occasion, while he was eating with them, he gave them this command: "Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait for the gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about. <sup>5</sup> For John baptised with water, but in a few days you will be baptised with the Holy Spirit."
- <sup>6</sup> Then they gathered around him and asked him, "Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?"
- <sup>7</sup> He said to them: "It is not for you to know the times or dates the Father has set by his own authority. <sup>8</sup> But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." <sup>9</sup> After he said this, he was taken up before their very eyes, and a cloud hid him from their sight.
- <sup>10</sup> They were looking intently up into the sky as he was going, when suddenly two men dressed in white stood beside them. <sup>11</sup> "Men of Galilee," they said, "why do you stand here looking into the sky? *This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into heaven.*"

Where Luke's Gospel is about what Jesus began, Acts is about what Jesus continues through the work of His Spirit and through the witness of His Apostles. Acts tells the story of the gospel, that is, the story of the life, death and resurrection of Jesus, spreading to the ends of the earth. The diagram below shows how the gospel grows and shows how the spread can be tracked through the chapters in Acts.

- 5. When you read that Jesus' disciples will be his "witnesses", what comes to mind?
- 6. What specific things will these witnesses bear witness to/about?

The Greek word used for *witnesses* is where we get the English word for *martyr*. So, while it carries the sense of testifying in legal matters and affirming the truth of something, it also means someone who bears witness at the cost of their life. As the book of Acts unfolds, we'll see the cost for the disciples as they stake their lives on the truth of Jesus' resurrection and we'll be challenged to consider whether we're prepared to stake our lives on Jesus too.

- Ask a Christian friend what convinces them about Jesus' resurrection.
- Read ch 13 in <u>THE REASON FOR GOD by Tim Keller</u>— "The Reality of the Resurrection"
- Read THE CASE FOR CHRIST by Lee Strobel

Do you expect that being a follower of Jesus will be comfortable? — How will you let the promise of God's Spirit encourage you to step outside your comfort zone and bear witness about Jesus?

Paul is quoting Habakkuk 1v5 which is a part of the Old Testament that comes just before God sent his people into exile. Paul is using Habakkuk to say to the crowd that they need to decide which side of the cause they will be on. Those who believe in Jesus will be set free, but those who scoff and doubt God's plans and purposes will face judgment.

Rather, Paul is focusing on how the Greek gods pale in comparison with the living God who is over all. He wants the people of Lystra to turn to him.

- We'll ask God to give our mission partner, Cam, a determination to teach and love the people in his care with faithfulness and gentleness, so that many in his city would believe in the grace God shows us in Jesus.

1. What is Paul accused of? How does he attempt to show the accusation is unfounded? Does it work?

#### READ ACTS 21v37-22v21

2. Why do you think Paul tells this story now? What does he want them to know about his view of the law? About Jesus? About his mission to the Gentiles?

The crowd doesn't react well - they're baying for his blood. The commander wants Paul flogged and interrogated until he realises that Paul is a Roman citizen and has the right to a trial. So instead, he takes Paul to the Sanhedrin (the Jewish religious council) to sort the matter out.

#### READ ACTS 22v30-23v11

3. What does Paul say is the real reason he is on trial?

Paul is whisked back to the barracks as the trial gets violent. Meanwhile, a plot is discovered to kill him when he is next on the way to the Sanhedrin. So Paul is transferred to Caesarea and the custody of Governor Felix, who was in charge of enforcing Roman law in the area of Judea. Felix allows the high priest and his lawyer to present the case against Paul.

### READ ACTS 24v1-21

- 4. What is Paul accused of now?
- 5. What do you notice about the way Paul defends himself?

Felix doesn't decide Paul's case because he's hoping Paul will give him a bribe. Instead, he keeps him under guard for 2 years and they talk frequently about 'righteousness, self-control and the judgement to come'. Paul is still imprisoned when Felix is succeeded by Porcius Festus. Festus wants to get the matter sorted out quickly so he sets up court in Caesarea.

#### **READ ACTS 25v1-12**

6. What is Paul's next move in his own defence? Why does he do this? (cf Acts 23v11)

A few days later, Paul is invited to speak with King Agrippa. Agrippa is the grandson of Herod, who killed John the Baptist, and is the Jewish king under Roman control. Festus wants Agrippa's opinion about what do with Paul.

### READ ACTS 26v1-32

- 7. How has God used Paul's experiences to attest to the resurrection of Jesus, both to Jews and Gentiles? How does this line up with the prophets and Moses?
- 8. What can the gospel of Jesus do for those who have faith in him?
