

rockypc SERIES COMPANION 2021



Rockhampton Presbyterian Church (**rockypc**) is the oldest church in our city with ties back to 1861 when the first congregation was formed (just 3 years after settlement). Much has changed over 160 years! Rockhampton is now a large regional centre of more than 82 000 people and we long to see all of them know about the Lord Jesus, so they might turn to him in repentance and faith.



VISION

As a church, we're praying that God would give 8000 new people to Jesus in Rockhampton and Gracemere, in our generation, for a start. We're not praying for 8000 because we think the rest don't matter, but because, we all know at least 10 people. If 1 in 10 people belongs to Jesus, then it means everyone in our region has a chance to hear about Jesus as we grow disciples who sacrifice, serve and speak for the sake of others.



rockypc exists to grow disciples, under God, who sacrifice, serve and speak for the sake of others, to grow the gospel and the church, for the glory of Jesus.

MISSION

This mission arises from the Great Commission in Matthew 28v18-20 where Jesus sent his disciples into the world to make disciples.

Jesus said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

In obedience to Jesus, it is our desire to make and grow new disciples who love Jesus and it is our desire to grow as disciples, becoming more like Jesus as His Spirit transforms us.

GROWING NEW DISCIPLES

At **rockypc**, our desire is to reach into our community because there are more than 82 000 people in our region who need Jesus. Our core convictions drive us to reach those people in our community who don't yet know Jesus, since:

- 1. Heaven and Hell are real Revelation 21-22
- 2. Jesus really lived, died and rose again Hebrews 9v26-28
- 3. Jesus reigns supreme Colossians 1v15-23
- 4. Life for everyone is short, so compelled by love, we want everyone to know all about Jesus 2 Corinthians 5v14-15

"For Christ's love compels us, because we are convinced that one died for all, and therefore all died. And he died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for him who died for them and was raised again."

GROWING AS DISCIPLES

At **rockypc** we also want to grow as disciples because it is our conviction that the call to be a disciple is a call to imitate Jesus and grow to be like him. It's the call to live the life of the cross. In Luke 9v23, Jesus said:

"Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me."

So, we are growing disciples who sacrifice, serve and speak because that's what Jesus did.



SACRIFICE

Jesus offered up his life in death so that we might be transferred from the dominion of darkness into his kingdom of light. Our sins are therefore forgiven and we have eternal life; so then, we live lives of sacrifice knowing that living as disciples of Jesus will be costly but eternally worthwhile.



SERVE

Jesus did not come to be served but to serve and he demonstrated this throughout his life but ultimately by considering our needs ahead of his own; and so, we live lives of service knowing that we no longer live for ourselves, but as servants of Jesus Christ by following his example.



SPEAK

Jesus himself is the Word of God and he speaks of life, healing, forgiveness and hope to people in desperate need of good news. The great news about Jesus is a gospel we've heard and that we're called to obey. This means we must speak the good news about Jesus to others so that they might also become his disciples.

CORE VALUES

As we seek to grow disciples, it is important to consider how growth happens, because this will determine where we focus our time, energy and resources to fulfil our mission as we see more and more people given to Jesus.

In this series we'll spend time in thoughtful reflection on God's word and see that God desires (at least) FIVE THINGS for his people as they grow and mature as disciples of Jesus.



If God desires these things for his disciples, we want to value them too and seek to grow in them. They will be at the heart of all we do at **rockypc**. It is our hope that as we understand what God values, we'll get excited about being part of his work in our region.

HOW TO GET THE MOST OUT OF THIS SERIES COMPANION

ON YOUR OWN—Take your time reading through each of the passages and consider how they contribute to each CORE VALUE. If you have time, work through the questions before your GROWTH GROUP so that you've started thinking about the topic before you arrive.

WITH YOUR GROWTH GROUP—Don't be afraid to stop and talk about things that grab your attention or raise questions for you. The study questions are there as a guide, but there's lots more to be said about each CORE VALUE. Feel free to explore other Bible passages too, as time allows.

ON SUNDAY—Make sure you bring your series companion along with you, so that you can keep track of any questions you have and record the way that God's Spirit is helping you to understand His Word and grow in your love for Jesus.

These series companions are designed to be used as either a print version, or interactively on a device. Use whichever method is most helpful for you.

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GETTING STARTED

How would you finish this sentence?

The best thing about reading the Bible is...

At **rockypc**, we value being Deep in the Word, because from the very first sentences in the Bible, we learn that our God is a speaking God.

READ GENESIS 1

1. What does God's word do or achieve here?

As God acts in the story of the Bible, with one family and nation in particular, we see his word at work in more ways among them.

READ EXODUS 3v11-15

2. How does God reveal himself to the Israelite nation? What is important for them to know about him?

The Israelite God goes on to speak commands and laws to his people as part of their covenant relationship with him.

READ DEUTERONOMY 6v1-9

3. How important should God's words be to the people of Israel?

4. What is their motivation to respond obediently to his words?

God sometimes speaks directly to the characters in the Bible, but often they are heard through someone else.

READ DEUTERONOMY 18v15-20

5. What do we learn about prophets and God's word here?

Why do we treat the Bible (a collection of smaller books written over thousands of years by numerous authors) as the word of God?

Isn't it just a human book of stories, letters and poems that contain some things God actually said?

The Bible is a self-aware book. It contains its own reflections on its authors and how they came to write words that were inspired by God, to be listened to and obeyed because they come from him. For example, Deuteronomy 28v58-61; Nehemiah 8; Luke 24v25-27; 2 Tim 3v16-17; 1 Peter 1v10-12; 2 Peter 1v12-21; 3v15-16; Revelation 22v18-19.

Some point out that this is a circular argument as if the Bible is saying 'Believe I'm the Word of God because I say I am'. This is unavoidable, because there can be no greater authority than the word of God! But to the believer, these are not just words on a page. Jesus alone has the words of eternal life, and we have nowhere else to go (John 6v68-69). The words are alive - cutting us to the heart and bringing us life (Hebrews 4v12-13; Romans 1v16-17). But no one can believe the Bible's testimony about itself unless God's Spirit has given them eyes to see (2 Corinthians 4v3-6).

From Adam and Eve's rejection of God's word on page 3 of the Bible, humanity has not responded to God speaking with devotion and obedience. Ultimately, this lands Israel in exile, under God's word of judgement (eg Isaiah 48v1-11).

That is, until God speaks again.


Seek God together in prayer now - in awe of his holiness, in repentance, faith, love, praise and thanks.

Give us the 30 second version of who spoke it to you and how. From the first pages of the Bible we see that the Creator God cares for all of humanity (Genesis 1v27-28). As they spread over the earth (Genesis 11v1-9), God chooses one man, Abraham, and his family (Genesis 12v1-3). Through that family, God says he'll bless all peoples (12v3). So even though the majority of the Old Testament is the story of God's relationship with one family, his heart is for all of humanity (see Isaiah 60v1-9). The hope of this blessing to all people is not realised until the coming of God's own son (John 1v9-14). **READ LUKE 19v1-10** 1. Why did Jesus come? **READ MATTHEW 28v16-20** 2. What does Jesus command his followers to do? Why? READ ROMANS 10v8-17 & 2 CORINTHIANS 5V14-6V2 3. What desires and convictions drive us to speak about Jesus? 4. 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GETTING STARTED

What is one thing you're passionate about at rockypc?

Over the past few weeks as we've been thinking about our CORE VALUES, we've seen that we respond to God speaking by getting deep in his word; we respond to his character by seeking him in faith, prayer and praise and we respond to his salvation by being on mission to share Jesus with others. Today, we're thinking about how to respond to God's love by serving one another.

God's character has always been a motivator to care for others.

READ HIS WORDS TO ISRAEL IN DEUTERONOMY 10v14-19

1. How were Israel's actions to match their God?

READ 1 JOHN 4v7-21 AND PHILIPPIANS 2v1-11

2. As those who know Jesus, we see even more clearly God's great love, compassion and kindness. How does our love for brothers and sisters in Christ flow from the love he's shown us?

3. How does James flesh out what love (and faith in Jesus) look like?

READ 1 CORINTHIANS 12v4—13v7 AND ROMANS 12v3-16

- 4. What metaphor does Paul use to describe Jesus' church?
- 5. How does this show both the unity and diversity of people and gifts of God's Spirit?
- 6. If these are gifts of God's grace, how should we treat one another? (notice that 1 Corinthians 13 is talking about church relationships not marriage)

Below are some myth busters about spiritual gifts:

1. My gifts aren't very 'spiritual'.

Notice that there are a number of less 'spiritual' sounding gifts in the Romans passage above. If you are gifted at administration, that is just as helpful and necessary as teaching gifts. We want to be organised because it's more loving than chaos! So you can use whatever God has given you to love and build others up.

2. I don't see anything I'm gifted with in these lists.

Neither of these lists are exhaustive. They are just some examples of gifts God grants to his people to grow one another in Christ. You can look at other lists in Ephesians 4v1-16 or 1 Peter 4v8-11.

3. I don't have any gifts.

These gifts are for each member of Jesus' body, given without favouritism - so yes, you do!

4. I need a long questionnaire to know what my gifts are.


There is no magic formula to determine a precise gift. If you're not sure how you can serve, ask yourself some questions like 'What am I passionate about?' Where is there a need?' What could I have a go at?' Or talk with others, like Matt, about where they think your gifts might lie. It might be a case of trying things out until you find a niche or even growing into a role you've never considered before.

Thank God for giving you the gifts to serve in these ways so that you can show love to others as he's shown it to you. Pray that Christ's body at **rockypc** would be built up as we serve one another.

Spend some time seeking God about these things now. Pray that you'd remember his extraordinary mercy and that your life/our lives would be given to Jesus in whole-of-life worship. Pray for us to be joyfully deep in the word, genuinely seeking God, urgently on mission and lovingly serving in a transformed community of Jesus' disciples.

WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BE ON MISSION TOGETHER?

God gave the apostles a special task in spreading the news of Jesus' death, resurrection and return. But this is a task that all believers carry on. The gospel comes to each of us, on its way to someone else. In love, we are all compelled to prayerfully speak to those in our lives who are facing judgement without Jesus. But there are some ways that we can share in this privilege together.
