

From the very first words of the Bible, we see God turn chaos into order, as he goes about his work of creating, shaping and filling the world by his commands (Genesis 1). An underlying premise throughout the Bible is that God has made the world with an order that brings about our flourishing when we live within it, and our demise when we spurn it. And it is no different with the people that God saves for himself, through Jesus. 1 Timothy shows that we are to think of church as God's household, his family. And this family has an order that reflects and displays the glorious gospel by which we're saved. Faith in the good news of Jesus means living out God's ordering as a community and family together.

1 TIMOTHY'S THEMES

Here are a couple of big themes to look out for:

- 1. Paul's 'trustworthy sayings' and sound doctrine which he is passing on. This is in contrast with false teaching that causes controversy and strife.
- 2. False or true teaching is always reflected in the teacher's life. So we should examine these in ourselves (if we're teachers) and choose leaders who set a good example in word and action.
- 3. Family relationships within the church are how we care for each other and they speak volumes to non-believers. Notice also, how Paul pays attention to the way we function differently, as men and women, in God's household.
- 4. The precious gospel gems which are sprinkled throughout the letter, e.g. God's immense patience shown to the worst of sinners (1v16); Jesus the mediator who gave his life as a ransom for us (2v5-6); and, Jesus' appearing and ascension (3v16)

WHO WAS PAUL?

Paul was a Pharisee, a teacher of the Hebrew Scriptures, who is first mentioned in the Bible when he witnesses and approves of the killing of Stephen, a Christian martyr (Acts 7v58-8v1). Paul goes on to threaten murder and imprison other Christians, before he is confronted by the risen Jesus (Acts 9). After seeing Jesus, Paul has a complete change of heart and life as he becomes a missionary around the Roman world, starting and strengthening churches (Acts 13-28). He wrote many letters to these churches, which now form much of our New Testament. 1 Timothy is a letter Paul wrote to Timothy, while Timothy was pastoring a church in Ephesus. However, the letter also contains lots of teachings that are for the wider church.

WHO WAS TIMOTHY?

Timothy heard the gospel from his mother and grandmother (2 Tim 1v5). But Paul considered him a son in the faith (1 Tim 1v2). They first met in Lystra in Acts 16. Timothy then began to travel extensively with Paul and also to visit churches on his behalf. Many of Paul's letters are written with Timothy. The book of 1 Timothy is written from mentor to student, so that if Paul was delayed in his trip to Ephesus, Timothy would 'know how people ought to conduct themselves in God's household, which is the church of the living God.' (3v14-15).

WHEN DID PAUL WRITE THIS FIRST LETTER TO TIMOTHY?

1 Timothy was probably written in the early-mid 60s AD. It is unclear where Paul was when he wrote to Timothy, but possibly during his travels of Acts 20.

WHAT WAS EPHESUS LIKE?

Ephesus was a prominent, wealthy, Greek seaport. The predominant religion was worship of the goddess Artemis (see Acts 19). When Paul travelled there, many believed his message and honoured Jesus, while others opposed him and incited riots. Paul also made a last visit to the Ephesian elders on his way to certain imprisonment in Jerusalem (Acts 20). And he wrote this church the letter we know as 'Ephesians', during his later imprisonment in Rome.

HOW TO GET THE MOST OUT OF THIS SERIES COMPANION

ON YOUR OWN—Take your time reading through the passage. If you have time, work through the questions before your GROWTH GROUP so that you've started thinking about the topic before you arrive.

WITH YOUR GROWTH GROUP—As you talk through the questions, see how the gospel shapes our relationship within God's household, as we hold onto its truth by faith.

Paul is concerned that 'God's work', which is understood by faith, is advanced. This term (oikonomia theou) is less about carrying out specific actions, such as proclaiming the gospel, and more about understanding the way that God has ordered the world. God created the world by bringing order out of chaos and darkness (Genesis 1). This demonstrates something essential about the world, ie that God has made it with an underlying structure, plan and purpose. We see this even more clearly in the gospel (eg Acts 2v22-24). God's fundamental structuring of the world (oikonomia theou) is the reason that God's church is similarly structured as his household (oikos theou - 3v15). By faith in the gospel of Jesus, God's household can understand and live according to God's ordering. False teachers in Ephesus are departing from this gospel order (even though we can't exactly be clear what their teachings were).

Paul tells us that he is proclaiming Jesus' salvation that leads to godliness and holiness. And that leads him into talking about how this will look different for men and women in God's household (remember his purpose in writing in 3v14-15).

The last four verses of this chapter often provoke strong feelings in us - they are controversial, angering or at least puzzling. In Australia, we have been breathing the air of feminism for 60 years now. And while there have been benefits to this way of thought, it has also taught us to view God's word suspiciously when it talks about gendered roles within the household of God. We need to acknowledge this cultural lens, and remind ourselves again that God's word is always good for us (2 Timothy 3v14-16). Just as we trust God's goodness in saving us through Jesus in v5-6, we can trust his goodness in showing us what godliness and holiness looks like in God's household, for both men and women. So we need to read these next Bible verses to critique our culture, not the other way around.

Paul limits teaching and authority over God's gathered household to qualified men (not all men, see 3v1-13). All women don't submit to all men, but to church leaders. When this is hard for us to hear, we can remember that it is a normal part of the Christian's life to submit in a variety of ways, eg to Jesus, pastors, governments, our parents etc. Women are of no lesser value to God or his church because they may hold different roles. We are equal in dignity and status before God, even in our differences. This passage does not say that women should have no voice or opinions. Women can have many word ministries within the body — praying, prophesying (1 Corinthians 11v5), bringing the word to bear informally through speech and song (Colossians 3v16), to other women and children (Titus 2v3-5). While seeking to faithfully apply Paul's instructions, we need to be careful not to place greater limits on women's teaching roles than he does, nor to undervalue the many ways they can serve.	

Verse 15 can be confusing, as we ask what childbearing has to do with salvation. Paul is clear that salvation is through the one mediator and ransom — Jesus Christ (v5-6). He is using the word 'save' in v15 in a similar way to 4v16, where he encourages Timothy to persevere in sound doctrine for that is where salvation is found. Which leaves us with 2 main options for what Paul may mean by childbearing:

- 1. God promised Eve that her offspring would ultimately crush the serpent's head (Genesis 3v15) and we know that comes true with Jesus (Colossians 2v13-15). Eve was saved through childbearing that led to Jesus, and therefore to salvation for us all.
- 2. Childbearing may be shorthand for the differences between men and women, as it is a uniquely female privilege. Women can embrace their God-given responsibilities rather than assuming the responsibilities of leadership over men, as Eve did in error (see also 1 Timothy 5v9-10, 14; Titus 2v3-5). Women hold to their salvation in Jesus by continuing in these roles with all holiness. This doesn't mean that all women must have children to be saved, but regardless of marital or motherhood status, they can live within God's good patterns of relationships.

Whichever option we choose, we can see how verse 15 adds to Paul's point about male and female relationships within God's household.



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GETTING STARTED

If you could use one word to describe your household, what would it be?

In this section, Paul describes what leaders in God's household should be like and why. He talks about 3 groups of leaders - overseers, male deacons and female deacons (or perhaps deacons' wives). Each of these groups should demonstrate similar characteristics, as we will see when we get into the passage. But we have limited information about what the differences in role are between deacons and overseers. It seems as though overseers may have had a governance and teaching role (v2), while deacons assisted in some way by serving (the word 'deacon' means 'servant'). Regardless of the particular roles, Paul is clear that churches should have a leadership structure, as God's household.


As we think about the qualities of leaders at **rockypc**, we can see how each of us can follow the godly example they set, in order to grow in the deep truths of the faith. SERVE is one of our core values, because every part of our **rockypc** community can use their gifts to build God's household - growing *as* disciples of Jesus and growing *new* disciples of Jesus. In a couple of weeks' time, on 29th May, we are having SERVE Sunday, where we will all have the opportunity to nominate where we'd like to serve God's household at **rockypc**. So we're going to spend a few minutes now thinking about why and how we can do this.

READ TITUS 3v1-8

- 10. What is the goal of God's gracious actions? (v1-2; 7-8)

In view of God's kindness to us in Jesus and the generous renewal of his Holy Spirit, spend some time thinking about how you can be ready to do good, in our **rockypc** community and our city. Take a look at the team chart below and speak with a team leader about what is involved.



- Thank God for giving us leaders to oversee and to serve, so that we can be built up in the truth as God's household. Pray that our leaders would grow in all of these character traits, that they would have integrity in their private and public lives and that they would be trustworthy teachers of the truths of our faith.
- Pray that we would look for leaders like this, respect them and follow their example, so that God would grow each of us in these qualities.
- Thank God for his loving kindness shown to us in Jesus. Pray that we would be renewed by his Spirit to do good by serving one another. Pray for SERVE Sunday to be a day of thanksgiving and commitment to grow disciples together.



READ 1 TIMOTHY 5v1-2

1. How should we view other men and women at rockypc?

READ 1 TIMOTHY 5v3-16

Paul spends a number of verses addressing the issue of how to care for widows as vulnerable members of God's household. He has three different types of widows that he cycles through in his discussion — older widows who have family members to care for them; younger widows; and, older widows with no family.

We can be tempted to dismiss this passage because, in Australia, we have a system of social welfare that didn't exist in the 1st Century. But statistically, women whose husbands have died are the most economically, socially and physically vulnerable around the world. And this is also true for Australian widows. We can also think this passage no longer applies because feminism has taught us that women don't need men and shouldn't be defined by their absence. This undermines the Bible's teaching about our interdependence as men and women (eg Genesis 1v26-28; 1 Corinthians 11v7-12); it minimises the unique one flesh relationship of husband and wife (Genesis 2v21-25); and it devalues women's caring roles within the home (Titus 2v3-5).

So as we look at this part of the Bible as God's timeless truth to us, we want to see how it flows from God's own heart.

READ PSALM 68v4-6

- 2. How does God treat the vulnerable members of our community? (See also passages like Deuteronomy 10v17-19; 24v17-22; Isaiah 1v16-17; Luke 7v11-17 and James 1v27 for the way that Israel and Christians should treat widows, orphans and foreigners based on God's heart)
- 3. Who should look after widows if they have families, and why? v4; 7-8; 16 (note that v4 is talking to male family members in the original Greek; and see also Deuteronomy 5v16)
- 4. In what ways do you think young widows might be tempted away from Christ by their sensual desires? v11-15

5. How might remarriage foster godliness in young widows?
6. What qualifies a woman to receive honour and practical support from their church? v3, 5, 9-10
It is unlikely that there was a particular 'list' of widows, as though it was some kind of formal order that required a vow of celibacy. Nor are these women necessarily employees of the church receiving payment, as their good deeds are more about their track record of good character. Paul just wants to be clear about who really needs help from the church and what godliness looks like for these women and their families.
READ 1 TIMOTHY 5v17-25 7. How should teaching elders be treated in God's household? Why?
8. How does it comfort and warn us to know that God and Christ Jesus see all, even what is hidden from us?
READ 1 TIMOTHY 6v1-2b 9. How should slaves and masters treat one another in God's household?
Paul is not advocating for the institution of slavery (see also 1 Corinthians 7v17-24). His focus in this section is on vulnerable members of God's household: destitute widows, elders whose livelihood is dependent on the church's generosity and slaves whose lives are at the mercy of their masters. In their position of powerlessness, slaves demonstrate godliness by respecting their masters, and, in their position of power, master are devoted to the welfare of their slaves. While we don't have a direct equivalent in our society of slaves in our households, we can reflect on what godliness looks like whenever power dynamics are at play eg work, school, community organisations.

- Pray that we would show honour and practical care to widows in our own families and at **rockypc**. Confess where we've failed to do this well. Pray that we'd be motivated to please God, to be blameless and put our religion into practice by supporting and providing for widows in many ways.
- Pray that we would honour and be generous towards our leading and teaching elders, while not tolerating sin.
- Pray that we would show respect to those in authority over us and devotion to the welfare of those over whom
 we have authority.
- Pray that God's name would be honoured in our community by the way we care for others in our church family.
