## GUARDING THE GOOD DEPOSIT

2 HIVOTHY



If you knew you were going to die soon, what would be most important to you? Paul's second letter to Timothy shows what is in the forefront of his mind. Paul is in prison in Rome and knows that he will soon be executed for preaching about Jesus. His letter shows an urgency and a grief, knowing that his end is near. But this is heightened by Paul's awareness of the ultimate end, when Jesus will appear. So Paul urges Timothy in these ways:

- 1. To guard the good deposit of the gospel. Timothy should pass on the truth of Jesus that he has heard, to those who will faithfully pass it on to others.
- 2. To be equipped by the Scriptures (in the power of the Spirit) so that he may preach it, to correct, rebuke and encourage others.
- 3. To be aware of false teaching. Timothy needs to know how destructive it is to get caught up in foolish quarrels and the resulting depravity. But Paul wants false teachers to be instructed gently, in the hope that they will be granted repentance.
- 4. To suffer for the gospel. Paul has been deserted by many of his friends and co-workers in his imprisonment. So he invites Timothy to suffer with him, strengthened by Jesus' grace, confident in character and power, knowing that he needs to endure to the end as a faithful servant who will be rewarded by the Lord.

#### WHO WAS PAUL?

Paul was a Pharisee, a teacher of the Hebrew Scriptures, who is first mentioned in the Bible when he witnesses and approves of the killing of Stephen, a Christian martyr (Acts 7v58-8v1). Paul goes on to threaten murder and imprison other Christians, before he is confronted by the risen Jesus (Acts 9). After seeing Jesus, Paul has a complete change of heart and life as he becomes a missionary around the Roman world, starting and strengthening churches (Acts 13-28). He wrote many letters to these churches, which now form much of our New Testament. 2 Timothy is a letter Paul wrote to Timothy, while Timothy was pastoring a church in Ephesus. However, the letter also contains lots of teachings that are for the wider church.

#### WHO WAS TIMOTHY?

Timothy heard the gospel from his mother and grandmother (2 Tim 1v5), but Paul considered him a son in the faith (1 Tim 1v2). They first met in Lystra in Acts 16. Timothy then began to travel extensively with Paul and also to visit churches on his behalf. Many of Paul's letters are written with Timothy. The book of 2 Timothy is written from mentor to student, almost as last words on how Timothy can guard the gospel after Paul dies.

#### WHEN DID PAUL WRITE THIS SECOND LETTER TO TIMOTHY?

2 Timothy was probably written in the mid 60s AD, around 5 years after he wrote 1 Timothy. Paul is in a Roman prison at the time of writing and he hopes there's time for Timothy to see him before his execution (4v9).

#### WHAT WAS EPHESUS LIKE?

Ephesus was a prominent, wealthy, Greek seaport. The predominant religion was worship of the goddess Artemis (see Acts 19). When Paul travelled there, many believed his message and honoured Jesus, while others opposed him and incited riots. Paul also made a last visit to the Ephesian elders on his way to certain imprisonment in Jerusalem (Acts 20). And he wrote this church the letter we know as 'Ephesians', during his later imprisonment in Rome (probably an earlier imprisonment than in 2 Timothy).

#### HOW TO GET THE MOST OUT OF THIS SERIES COMPANION

ON YOUR OWN—Take your time reading through the passage. If you have time, work through the questions before your GROWTH GROUP so that you've started thinking about the topic before you arrive.

WITH YOUR GROWTH GROUP—As you talk through the questions, see how we can hold on to the true gospel in the face of opposition.

ON SUNDAY—Make sure you bring your series companion along with you, so that you can keep track of any questions you have and record the way God's Spirit is helping you to understand His Word and grow in your love for Jesus.

#### **READ 2 TIMOTHY 3v1-9**

'The last days' is a phrase often used in the Bible to talk both of a time of human depravity, but also the time of God's salvation. But it's not some future event, as though the world is heading for worsening calamity. We are in the last days now. It's the time from Jesus' appearing until his return (See for example Acts 2v17, Hebrews 1v2 and James 5v3). Paul is warning us to expect to see sinfulness and false teaching now, as we live in the last days.

Jannes and Jambres aren't mentioned by name anywhere else in the Bible. But it was well known in Paul's day that other Jewish sources name them as sorcerers who worked for Pharoah at the time of the Exodus (eg 7v11, 22; 8v7). They copy Moses' miracles but they're using their secret arts to keep the Israelites in slavery. In a parallel way, the false teachers in 1st Century Ephesus were gaining control over others and burdening them with sin. This is in contrast with the unchained gospel of Jesus who achieves our glory and reign with him (2v9-12).

Please also note that Paul is not saying all women are gullible! But rather, it's a comment on the despicable behaviour of these particular false teachers, who are taking advantage of some women.
